Meeting Called to Order 10:15 a.m.

Attendance - A quorum was recognized.

Minutes of the **March 7th, 2010** meeting were posted on the website and copies were made available at the meeting. **Mike Kaerne** asked for a motion to adopt the minutes as published.

Larry Bell *moved* to adopt the minutes, *seconded* by **Bruce Yeo**. All were in favour and there were no abstentions. The motion was *carried*.

President's Welcome

Mike Kaerne welcomed all present, and reviewed the agenda for the day. He then asked for the Discipline Reports.

DISCIPLINE REPORTS

Race - **Steve Paquette**

- 192 Licence holders this year
- We sanctioned a new school this year - Allan Berg Racing School
- We had our school on the Island and our two S.C.C.B.C. schools
- There were 6 race weekends, all really well attended
- Oct. 9-10th weekend had the largest attendance of any final race weekend to date
- The CCGP weekend we sanctioned was very successful
- Looking forward to next year, hoping the schedule doesn't have such a large gap between August and October

Solo Sprint - **Campbell Carlyle**

- 76 license holders
- 2010 SoloSprint Series consisted of 8 events (5 at Mission, 2 at Western Speedway and 1 in Kelowna) Thank you to the clubs who hosted the events, SCCBC, VMSC and KMMC.
- 8 competitors received Championship Series awards, including a husband and wife
- Paid out over \$1400. in travel fund.

Autoslalom - Jim Sandwith

- 2010 will see a total of 61 club autoslalom events. That's down about 12 from last year, mainly accounted for by the move of the Kelowna Corvette Club back to the Western Council of Corvette Clubs after a season of affiliation with CACC
- There were no Regional events held this year but many of the 9 clubs that hold slalom events have well developed club championship series that suit their members, the venue available to them and the time of year they run. No two clubs are alike.
- It has been a busy year for me:
 - trying to improve communications with the member clubs that host autoslaloms
 - splitting the Autoslalom Rule Book from the Solosport Regulations
 - learning how to attend executive meetings by Skype
 - trying to ensure that all autoslalom events had an Event Report by a steward or in 3 cases by the organizer
 - attending and participating in many club's autoslalom events and even 1 race weekend at Mission
- I've come to the conclusion that there are many skilled, knowledgeable volunteers out in the clubs that host autoslalom events and they are doing good work. I hope my efforts this year will help to support their efforts and the future success of their clubs in autoslalom.
- What limits and threatens the future of this sport are the venues available. No club owns their venue. They are all renters.
- If the Autoslalom Discipline and CACC want growth and a secure future for this sport, this most difficult issue needs to be faced.
- I'd like to recommend that CACC consider the development of a provincial strategy, regionally focused, to locate, to secure and to improve sites for autoslalom.
- CACC and interested affiliated clubs should agree on roles and responsibilities should this be undertaken. Co-operation between clubs and with CACC will be essential. Co-operation between sanctioning bodies may be required as we realize that others exist and their affiliated clubs compete for use of the same venues as use throughout the province.
- In closing, I recognize that this cannot happen overnight. It will only occur over the long term by committed, dedicated people. Maybe the first step is to just dream a little.

National Solosport - Marcel Poitras

- Canadian Autoslalom Championship was in Quebec this year and was well attended. For 2011, there are a couple of clubs from Southern Alberta teaming up, but no official proposal yet.
- There was no Solosprint Championship in 2010, but there is a proposal from Ontario for 2011 with the event to be held at Mosport.
- Rule Books are being revised for National Solo and the GCRs so they will be consistent and in agreement as far as safety regulations go.
- New helmet regs, the Snell 2010 helmets are becoming available now and have been added to the list as well as keeping the Snell 2000 standard as listed by the FIA. The Snell 2000 will be acceptable for two more years to come.

- There is a proposal from the National Solo Committee to switch the National Autoslalom Rule Book to use SCCA car prep and classing. This came about because 2 of the 5 regions already use SCCA classing and the other 2 are planning on making the switch for the coming year. The safety, course design and event guideline sections will remain the same as current.
- The National Solosprint Rule Book will change to align with CASC-Ontario prep and classing, so that Ontario online classing software can be used nationally.

Ice Race - *Doug Wall*

- The season was short as last winter was an el nino winter.
- Knox Mountain Motor Sport put on zero (0) events
- WCIRABC was able to get 2 ½ of their 4 scheduled weekends in.
- There were 36 licence holders last year
- Hopefully since this coming winter is supposed to be a la nina year, both clubs should be able to get a full season in.

Vintage - *Jim Latham*

- Vintage enjoyed a very successful year. Grids for most Sunday Races were excellent, culminating in 16 cars registered for the Final Race.
- The BCHMR was not as financially successful as the Westwood50 reunion of course, and there were a very large number of entrant cancellations. SOVREN had three events on successive weekends with the BCHMR ending the set. A number of mechanical failures and accidents at Portland and Seattle, and economic challenges affected entries. However, the publicity done and the excellent weather ensured excellent gate receipts.
- On the reverse of this report (handout was available) are the final standings for the REVS series, including VRCBC Members who participated in the BCHMR.
- Mark Brown in his Lotus 7 is the REVS Champion, and worthy he is.
- Next year there are at least two more vehicles expected to add to the Sunday Grid.
- Of note is that since Open Wheel and Closed Wheel cars can no longer run together, including Vintage Racing cars with RACE on Saturday and Sunday has been successful. We anticipate that there will be growth in Vintage Open Wheel and Sport Racing Cars.
- We are indebted to SCCBC, CACC, META and all the Volunteers for their work to support Vintage. We can promise you an even better show in 2011.

Track Officials - *Dave Bell*

- CACC's newest discipline is the Track Officials Discipline created this year
- Worked on developing a marshal's licence
- Developed a new Log Book, and a Discipline Rule Book that we will be voting on today.

Novice Director - *Curt Storms*

- Wanted to thank **Dave Stenner** for all the help this year and also **Steve Paquette**.
- There were over 60 Novices in the Race program in 2010 making this probably the biggest year ever.

- Wanted to thank every one of those Novices for coming out, going through our program. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves.
- Revamped the program a little, having the Vintage Novices coming across to Race then returning to Vintage
- Thanks to the two schools (SCCBC and Allen Berg) who supplied the time and effort for these new people.
- We have our new Junior Race Licence program in place as per ASN ruling of April 8, 2010. *"Applicants who are 15 years old shall meet the following requirements:*
 - i) Have achieved their 15th birthday. There will be no exceptions.*
 - ii) Produce a valid karting licence issued by ASN Canada FIA or an ASN affiliated kart club*
 - iii) Proof of competing in at least two full seasons of ASN-sanctioned kart racing*
 - iv) Have successfully completed a CACC or ASN recognized Race Driving School*
 - v) Have passed and submitted the normal CACC/ASN medical examination for a first time applicant*

Mike mentioned that we have had 2 Juniors this year. We had the first one in Canada, and then the second young man this summer. That particular program is meant to help with the progression from karting. Most of the time you can't get in a race until you are 16 - 16 $\frac{1}{2}$, so we are losing a lot of young boys and girls in that year and a half to motorcycles or other sports because in that year and a half (which is a long time to a 15 year old) they have nothing to do. It is a cross-Canada program and it has grown quite a bit.

Race/Vintage Novice Licence when they successfully complete their training. The licences will be of equal value. This will eliminate the problems of the past where Senior Vintage Drivers had to be observed if they planned on competing with the Senior Race Drivers.

- In a survey we did of our members; we have a lot to discuss on eligibility of all Vintage cars.
- We are currently at 1974 for production cars, and the debate is should it be 1980 (30 years)? We don't need to decide until the race season start, so the debate will continue.
- We are trying to structure what you can and can't race in Vintage.
- All the information is on our website and some of the homologation paper listings are there already and we are just trying to work our way through the whole thing.
- We are indebted to SCCBC, CACC, META and all the volunteers for all their help.

UBC Sports Car Club - James McLeod (President)

- 2010 has been a great year for us
- We've had 18 events in total, 15 of those were Autocross and 3 of them were track days out at Mission
- We have purchased a trailer that provides shelter from the rain for members
- There are 351 members this year
- It is our 53rd year in operation

Victoria MG Club -Chris Wignall (President) written report submitted

We have 120 members at last count, only slightly down from last year at this time.

This year's calendar included the usual car shows, parades, and ice cream runs. There was also a run organized to the Portland Historic Races over the Labour Day weekend that included 19 cars from our club. Our Anniversary Meet and Show will be scaled back this coming year; we will be eliminating trophies and prizes to make it an event more in keeping with the low-keyed nature of what the membership desires. Participation at our events has been consistent with or above this year across the board, with our Christmas Party already sold out.

In the 2010 season, we hosted 6 Autoslalom events, and one driver's training session. Our All-British Slalom continues to be our most popular event, with 50 entries in five run groups throughout the day. As with many other clubs, we faced venue challenges this year as the

Camosun parking lot surface continues to degrade, while more obstacles are added. Our events at Western Speedway are healthy, with an average of 36 entries, many of which are members of other clubs. Perhaps the biggest news this year was the retirement of Jim Mills who had been our Director of Motorsport for 23 years. The changeover to his successor, Glenn Jasechko, our current Vice-President, has so far been quite smooth, and both of them look forward to collaborating to continue the success of our events. Our AGM will be held December 13th, and we have a full slate of candidates for our club's thirtieth year. Every position is open every year, but volunteers are always hard to find so it is quite likely that the individuals who have already put their names forward will be elected. If this holds true, we will have a new Events Coordinator and a new Vice-President, and I will enter my 6th year as President of the club.

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

Treasurer - Carol Wong (written copy attached minutes)

Part of your handout package should include a double sided copy of Financials. Carol reviewed the current year financials. She then reviewed the Draft Budget and mentioned that it doesn't get ratified until the Spring AGM, and mentioned that this is just a working draft to allow for planning for the coming year. After the discipline meetings, anything that has come up will get rolled into the budget and formulated for the Spring AGM. Carol asked if there were any questions, there were none.

Mike mentioned that one thing that is in the Draft Budget for this year is that the Executive has been discussing a new method of issuing licences. We have for some time been looking at a machine that prints a "credit card" type of licence. It has been used in Conference, ASN also uses it and we are going to be going to the same or similar system for this year's licences. It prints the picture on the back and we can do bar codes for the clubs that use bar codes and if you have multiple disciplines, we can put them all on one licence. The cost of the machine that we originally looked at was around \$3000. but we have more than one Licensing Administrator, so after looking around, we can get 2 machines with software and cards and printing supplies and basically a year's worth of equipment for about \$3700. One machine will reside on the Island and one will be on the Mainland. The machine we are getting will print colour on the front and a black and white photo on the back. You will be asked to forward a jpeg picture of yourself to the administrator and if you are unable to do that, the kit comes with a camera and you can go see the administrator at an event or whatever and she will take your picture for you. Any digital camera will take one. The question was asked if the option would be to rent it out to clubs to produce I.D. cards internally. **Mike** stated the cost of printing these licences is fairly low and once we establish the exact cost we can put it out to the clubs and can do that. ASN currently prints all the karting licences, they charge \$2.50 or \$3.00 per licence to print them. **Darrin Linders** asked what format the bar code that will be printed on it. **Mike** clarified that the bar code is merely a font, so whatever bar code is used we can match the font. **Randy Custer** asked if you have to apply online. **Mike** stated that we are going to an online system, but we will still have the ability to do it by paper.

AWARDS

- Another first for this year, we decided to give '*keeper trophies*' to people who had won the perpetual trophies from last year. **Paul Bonner** was asked to assist with the presentation and **Mike** suggested that when the recipient of the *keeper trophy* came up to receive their award that they stay and present the perpetual to this year's recipient.
- **Mike** referred to the large brass perpetual trophies made by **Ed Deak**, and the fact that he had *Googled* Ed Deak because he really didn't know much about him. He found that Ed is still alive, he is 83 years old now and lives in a place called Big Lake which is north of Likely, B.C. He would have loved to be here today to present those trophies again but he is a colon cancer survivor and he has had a number of operations this year and is unable to travel. **Mike** remarked that he is a very interesting gentleman. The 3 drawings on the wall today, are all Ed's drawings from

the '60's. Those drawings are going to be given away today. The posters were made up by **Lorne Stead** who reproduced them from a small e-mailed picture that Ed sent. These particular trophies were cast in sand and completely hand-made. They are solid brass. It took about 200 hours to create each one. He created a number of trophies in the '60's and early 70's, many of them were *rally* trophies. Ed competed in the *Shell 4000* in 1966, 1967 and 1968. He was a member of the Nissan Motorsport Team back then. He was born in Hungary, a WW2 vet at 17, injured and in hospital in Austria. Moved to England, then Canada. Had a furniture shop in Richmond for many years. He was a motorsport competitor for many years. He moved up north in 1979 and lost track of all of these trophies. Hopefully Ed will be down next year to present these trophies in person. The amount of history he sent to Mike by e-mail was phenomenal.

Mike would like to see Vintage and Ice Race develop a perpetual trophy this year, to round out the trophies that are presented each year.

Some seat-belts won't work with certain devices, Hans devices have a 2 inch seat-belt channel, and 3 inch belts will slip off. There are several models to choose from, and seat-belt width is very important. Seat, seat belts, helmets and the Hans device must all be compatible. There will information on the CACC website to assist with specifications.
