The Time Attack rule change proposal is:

Delete the Section 14 (general definitions and guidelines), 17 (CAM), 18 (Street Prepared), 19 (Street Prepared), 20 (Street Prepared-X), 21 (Points), 24 (Categories), or any references to the Super Street or any 2020 classifications and replace with:

Vehicles are to be classed as per the current year's SCCA Time Trials National rules. For the 2021 calendar year 100-199 treadwear tires are to be considered equivalent to 200 treadwear but must be date stamped the 42nd week of 2020(Oct 11,2020) or older.

Vehicles must meet the greater of either SCCA or CACC GCR safety regulations
