How to volunteer



If tearing up the track at breakneck speeds is not your cup of tea, you can join our corps of talented and dedicated volunteers who make motorsport events run safely and efficiently. We have rewarding volunteer positions available for turn marshals, safety crew, in timing and scoring, track operations, administration, registration and in other skilled and unskilled areas.

Why Volunteer?

Volunteering is a great way to participate in motorsport and meet new friends. If you always wanted to get a little closer to the action, there is a place for you. Our volunteers share a common bond. Whether or not they have competed in auto sport events, they are driven by a passion for motorsports.

How do I get Started?

There is a wealth of information on the Confederation of Autosport Car Clubs (CACC) webpage. The volunteer page link is at the bottom of this page. You will also find information there on the affiliated auto sport clubs in BC and a calendar with a schedule of events. Auto sports includes road racing, auto slalom, time attack, lapping, ice racing, karting, vintage racing and officiating. Events are organized by the affiliate clubs. Volunteer Job Descriptions

If you're interested in volunteering, we have the job for you. Brief job descriptions for some positions are listed below. If you don't find anything to suit your skill level, don't worry, we have plenty of other opportunities for you. All our events run rain or shine and most positions are outside.

Flag/Turn Marshal -Flags are the method of communicating with the drivers while racing. Because volunteers are relatively close to the racing surface, the ability to stay alert and focused is vital to everyone's safety. Due to the proximity to the track, those under 16 years of age are not permitted to fill these positions. Knowledge of the racing flags and general competition rules is required. Training will be provided.

Communicator - Communicators keep each turn station in contact with race control by radio. Requirements include being able to speak clearly while under pressure and in a noisy environment. Because of the proximity to the racetrack, minors under 16 are not allowed to fill these positions.

Tech Inspectors - All racecars must pass a technical inspection before being allowed to enter the racing surface. A good automotive mechanical knowledge along with knowledge of the general competition regulation is required. Training will be provided.

Safety Team - If you have experience as a firefighter, medical emergency technician or tow truck operations these can be exciting positions. Because of the proximity to the racetrack, minors under 16 are not allowed to fill these positions. Includes positions on the crash trucks and tow/recovery trucks.

Pre-Grid Marshal - Responsible for ensuring drivers are properly belted in and have been through tech before entering the racing surface and for lining cars up in the correct qualifying order before a race.

Timing and Scoring - Working indoors. Knowledge of computers and the ability to work under pressure an asset. Every lap of every car must be recorded during an event.

Registration – Working indoors. Many of the events require the drivers to register before the event. Knowledge of computers and a good-natured attitude is required. Many new folks enter our events each year and customer service is key.

Track Announcer - If you are comfortable talking to the public this can be a fun position. Knowledge of racing and public address equipment along with a clear voice and good command of the English language an asset.

Driver Services - The go-to people when drivers are looking for information such as qualifying times/positions, race results, sound information, race schedules, trophies etc.
